




Whale Shark

Rhincodon typus



SCIENTIFIC NAME

Rhincodon typus (Smith, 1829)

DISTRIBUTION

Whale sharks live in the open ocean and inhabit all tropical and warm-temperate seas. Its range is generally restricted to about 30° latitude or lower.



BIOLOGY

- Unique cross-flow filtration filter pads for filter feeding.
- Unique eye retraction mechanism for eye protection.
- Only shark with protective denticles on their eyes.
- Solitary, but gather in large aggregations for seasonal feeding events.
- Can breathe without swimming through their spiracles.

SIZE

- Largest fish/shark.
- Max.: 60+ ft., ~40 tons
- Mature Male: 26 30 ft., 10 25 tons
- Mature Female: ~48 ft., 25 30 tons
- •Birth: 16-24 in., 1 2 lb.

LIFE SPAN

• 80 - 130 yrs.

COMMON NAME

WHALE SHARK, Tiburón ballena (MX), Tofu shark (TW).

IDENTIFICATION

- Dark grey upper body with pale spots and stripes
- Wide, flat head
- · Mouth in front of body
- Large, wide mouth almost as wide as body
- Small eyes near each corner of mouth
- 300 rows of tiny, teeth (~size of grain of rice)

Conservation Status: Endanged

- 20 filter pads inside mouth for filter feeding
- Three prominent ridges along side of body
- Two spiracles, one behind each eye
- Two dorsal fins
- One anal fin

REPRODUCTION

- Breeding starts at ~25 yrs. old.
- Males internally fertilze females.
- Gestation period UNKNOWN.
- Ovovivparity: eggs hatch in mother, pups born alive.
- Number of young from each breeding: 300+
- Not all pups born at once. Birthing period last a year.
- Pups can feed on their own as soon as they are born.

DIET

- Non-predatory filter feeder.
- Two feeding methods
 - 1. Passive ram filtration feeding
 - 2. Active suction feeding
- Feeds on small fish and plankton including copepods, krill, fish and coral eggs and larvae.

AQUA LUNG. Scuba Diving Equipment Checklist


√ MASK - This lets us see clearly underwater.



√ **FINS** - These paddle-like shoes give us more power for swimming underwater.



√ SNORKEL - A special tube we breathe through while swimming on the surface.





√ **WEIGHT BELT** - A special belt that holds the lead weights we need to go underwater. (A weight belt is <u>negatively buoyant</u>.)



 $\sqrt{}$ BUOYANCY COMPENSATOR (BC) - An inflatable vest we wear that lets us become weightless underwater. (A BC lets us become <u>neutrally buoyant</u>.)



 $\sqrt{\ }$ **AIR TANK** - A metal container that safely holds the air we breathe underwater.



√ REGULATOR - This is what we connect to the air tank to breathe from underwater.



√ **PRESSURE GAUGE** - This is connected to the *regulator* and shows us how much air is left in our *air tank*.



√ DIVING COMPUTER - This special, water-proof computer tells us how deep we are, how long we have been underwater, and when we must go back up to the surface.



√ **DIVE KNIFE** - This is not a weapon, but a tool we use underwater for prying, cutting, digging, pounding, measuring, etc.



√ COMPASS - We wear this to help us find our way underwater.



√ **VIDEO CAMERA & UNDERWATER HOUSING** - A waterproof case for using the video camera underwater.

Scientists have found more than 500 different kinds of sharks. Nobody is really sure exactly how many different kinds of sharks there are, because the oceans have not yet been fully explored. There are probably more sharks waiting to be discovered.

The largest shark is the Whale Shark. Whale sharks have been found over 60 feet long! Because sharks are fish the whale shark is also largest fish in the ocean. The whale shark is not a whale. It is called a "whale" shark because it is as big as a whale! Even though the whale sharks are the largest sharks they eat some of the smallest animals, just as big whales do.

Whale sharks are gentle plankton filter feeders. Whale sharks swim slowly through the oceans sucking up tiny planktonic animals and plants. The plankton that whale sharks eat may include tiny fish, krill, coral eggs, fish eggs, algae and other tiny plants.

To capture their tiny prey whale sharks don't have baleen, as some whales do. Instead, whale sharks have special filter pads in their mouths. These filter pads work much like baleen does for whales. The filter pads sift out the tiny plankton as the seawater passes through the whale shark's mouth and out its gills.

Whale sharks live in warm oceans and seas around the world. These slow-swimming animals are rarely seen, except when they migrate to special areas to feed at certain times of the year. One good place to see migrating whale sharks feeding is in the Caribbean Sea, along the Belize Barrier Reef at Gladden Spit. Each year dozens of whale sharks come here to feed on clouds of eggs laid by schooling snappers.


