Administration

Personnel

- New Adult Services Library and Volunteer Coordinator Edmund Balzer started on May 1.
- There were no other major personnel changes this month.
- Other staff changes have been reported in the Departmental reports.

Automation & Technology

- All staff Mac computers were replaced with PCs. Staff computers were updated to run the Windows 10 operating system, and we are in the process of migrating all users to Office 365, Microsoft's cloud-based Office suite of applications. OSG staff were on-site for 5 days during the migration and were extremely responsive to staff questions and issues.
- As part of the migration to Windows 10 and Office 365, I received a new laptop computer for my office. My old laptop was over 7 years old and had started to crash on a fairly regular basis.
- OSG continues preparation work on the replacement of the servers and setting priorities for other projects that need to be done.
- All outstanding issues related to our new copiers and printers have been addressed.
 The automatic toner replacement program alone has made management of these units much easier.

Building & Grounds - General

- Due to noise ordinances in place in the Village of Morton Grove, the Library will have to close in order to get the carpets cleaned. I will be discussing this more at our June meeting.
- Please see the monthly report of Facilities and Maintenance Manager Ed Tamras for more building and grounds related activity.

Legal/Financial

• The buyer of 6200 Lincoln Avenue has applied for a Special Use Permit with the Village asking them to waive the parking requirements. With assistance from Library attorney Frank Tennant the Library supplied the buyer with the relevant owner documentation.

- Brian LeFevre from Sikich presented the final audit to the Board at the May meeting.
 The audit did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that are considered material weaknesses. The final audit will be posted to our website.
- I have completed our annual Workers' Comp audit. Due to a decrease in payroll for covered positions, the Library will be receiving a credit on our next Workers' Comp insurance invoice.

- The Library once again is participating in the Adopt-a-Planter program with the Village. Special thanks to Helga Scherer for doing the actual planting this year!
- I continued with the work I've been doing with the Electronic Content Consortium in preparation for us to take over administration of the OverDrive service on July 1.

Brittany held her annual Famished for Fiction Meetup at the beginning of the month with help from James and Jess. Each year, kids who participate in the Famished for Fiction lunchtime book talk program at their schools (and the homeschool group that meets at the library) meet up all together for one big end-of-year celebration. This year, 29 kids came to the library for this afterhours event. Participants left with free copies of books (Advanced Readers Copies), and were really



excited to meet other readers from all over town.
